THE FIRST EPISODE PSYCHOSIS PROGRAM

provides trauma-informed care and early intervention to Delaware youth who have experiences indicating psychosis.

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A MOTHER AND HER 8-YEAR-OLD SON moved to flee domestic violence and were promised a place to stay with a friend. The “friend” stole her benefits and told her to move out the next day. With nowhere to go, no family, money, or transportation, she was desperate and came to **SETON CENTER**. We kept the family together, provided food, safe shelter, and bus tickets, ensured the child was enrolled in school, and supported the mother in securing a new job.



A SINGLE MOTHER OF THREE relocated to Delaware for a better life. She could not get a job, because her medical license was not valid in this state. State benefits were insufficient to cover rent and daily expenses. She came to our **BASIC NEEDS PROGRAM** for help. We provided rental assistance, and her family avoided homelessness until her license transferred and she obtained a hospital job.



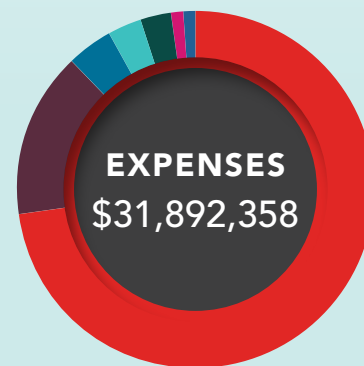
